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### “COWTOWN” DOES IT AGAIN

#### - FORT WORTH OPERA PREPARES FOR A MAJOR WORLD PREMIERE AND FESTIVAL

FORT WORTH – After ending the 2008/09 Season \$40,000 in the black, Fort Worth Opera is now focusing on the 2010 Festival and another major world premiere. The **operas for the 2010 Festival season** will be **Mozart’s *Don Giovanni*, Donizetti’s *The Elixir of Love***, and the **world premiere of *Before Night Falls* by Cuban-American** composer Jorge Martín, based on the memoir of the same name by Cuban author Reinaldo Arenas.

**The 2010 Festival** will run **May 22 – June 6, 2010** and all three operas will be performed in **Bass Performance Hall**. It will mark both the company’s fourth annual festival and the second main-stage world premiere, since changing to the festival format in 2007, when Fort Worth Opera produced the premiere of Thomas Pasatieri’s *Frau Margot*.

**Outside of the Festival**, Fort Worth Opera will host public performances of Children’s Opera Theatre productions usually performed in schools, *The Three Little Pigs* on March 15, 2010 and *The Billy Goats Gruff* on March 19, 2010, both at the Scott Theatre in Fort Worth. These productions will feature artists from the Fort Worth Opera Studio program, a training program for operatic artists beginning their careers.

**ABOUT FORT WORTH:** Nicknamed “Cowtown,” Fort Worth boasts a unique mix of western culture, urban sophistication and fine art. The city is home to world-renowned art organizations such as the Kimbell Art Museum, the Modern Art Museum of Fort Worth, the Amon Carter Museum and the Van Cliburn International Piano Competition. On the other end of the spectrum, the city sponsors daily cattle drives through its “Stockyards” district, hosts equestrian and livestock events throughout the year, and is home to the Cowgirl Hall of Fame. Downtown Fort Worth is a lively spot for residents and tourists; activities include fine dining, shopping, nightclubs and the opera house, Bass Performance Hall.

**ABOUT FORT WORTH OPERA:** Fort Worth Opera was founded in 1946 and is the oldest continually performing opera company in Texas, and one of the 14 oldest opera companies in the United States. In recent years, under the leadership of Darren Keith Woods, the company has gained national attention from critics and audiences alike for its artistic quality and willingness to take risks. In 2007, the company completely changed its fall/winter schedule to a condensed one-month long Festival in the spring. Darren Keith Woods, who began his operatic career in 1982 as a character tenor, joined Fort Worth Opera as General Director in 2001.
